#### 2023 Rules

- 1. Champlain Valley Fair will pay the cattle exhibitor \$70/head, and will include camping for 1 camper/exhibitor, base layer of sawdust bedding, 4 bales of straw to start plus 3 bales/day, 2 bags of wood shavings/day (based on a 6-animal exhibit, please contact the superintendent for adjustments to these numbers based on your entries).
- 2. There will be ribbons awarded.
- 3. The superintendent may apply limits to number of head exhibited depending on space allocation in the barn.
- 4. Arrival Departure: A. Open Show cattle will be in place by 4:00pm on Friday, August 25 and will be released at 5:30pm, Tuesday, August 29. B. All other cattle must be in place by 8:00am, Thursday, August 31 and will be released at 1:00am, Monday, September 4.
- 5. Entry fees are \$5.00 for individual animal. Entries are not complete until payment is received by the superintendent. No entry fees for group classes. Group class animals must have been shown in their respective individual class. Only one entry per exhibitor in each group class.
- Health Regulations are published by the Vermont Department of Agriculture and are the accepted standard for CVE. These rules and regulations are printed in full in this book.
- 7. Entries close Monday, August 14 and must be made on forms provided by the CVE or on a spreadsheet which includes all of the data on the entry form. Passes to the Fair will be available at Gate B upon arrival.
- 8. Parking requests should be mailed with completed entry forms and MUST be accompanied by the \$15.00 fee for each pass. Limit two per exhibit. Purchased passes will be mailed to exhibitors.
- 9. For the Open Show on August 28, registration certificate will be considered as proof of ownership, identity, age and breed of entry.

- 10. Milk-out: the judge, at his/her discretion, may require an animal to be milked out in their presence.
- 11. Responsibility: the management assumes no responsibility for loss or damage to stock or other exhibits for any cause and upon this condition only, entries are accepted.
- 12. Manure handling: each exhibitor is responsible for removal of manure from his/her own exhibit and should bring a wheelbarrow, forks and shovels.
- Additional straw, hay, grain and shavings will be available for purchase by exhibitors through our vendor.
- 14. Animals deemed unworthy for exhibition will be excused at the discretion of the Superintendent.
- 15. 'Best Exhibit' awards (1st-\$100, 2nd-\$75, 3rd-\$50). Exhibit should include identification cards above each animal, farm name and educational information about dairy cattle and agriculture. Keep in mind that your exhibit at the fair is an opportunity for you to interact with the public about dairy animals and their products.
